
Tips to Complete the Honors Advising Appointment Preparation Worksheet

Major Requirements and Sample Plan of Study

To find information regarding your major, start on the **Illinois State University home page**.

Click on Academics and then Majors.

Find your major using the A – Z links or by scrolling down the page. Once you are on the page for your major, click on **Course Requirements (Catalog)**. This will take you to your major department/school's section of the catalog.



On your Department/School's page, select View Course Requirements.


