Contract does not impact grade in class



Is there a related topic that "seems to be missing" or could potentially connect to the course content?

Could a deeper understanding of a certain topic or creation of a unique product support your career goals?

INITIATING HONORS CONTRACT Conversations

Taking a Single Topic Further:

"I reviewed the syllabus and see we are spending # classes on this topic. I am very interested in this topic and would like to complete an Honors Contract to explore it further.

- If you had the time in class and could take this topic further, what would you do?
- · What additional resources would you use? Are there scholars of this subject that I should know?
- Would you be willing to help me develop a plan?"

Proposing Interdisciplinary Learning:

"I see in the syllabus that we are studying <u>this topic</u>. I am very interested in learning more about how <u>this topic</u> relates to <u>that topic</u> by completing an Honors Contract.

- Are you aware of research that has already been done connecting these two topics?
- In what ways could I connect these two topics that could help me understand both more deeply?"

Creating a Specific Product with a Career in Mind:

"I am a(n) _____ major. I would like to apply the topics we are studying by developing a __(name of a product) _ that I could use when I am a __(career role) _ by collaborating with you to complete an Honors Contract."

Connecting an Interest to a Course Topic to Enrich Learning:



Dimensions of Honors Learning

The Illinois State University Honors Program is guided by a framework that challenges each learner, regardless of major, to strengthen six marketable skills.



Critical Thinking

Go beyond your initial understanding to evaluate and make your own conclusions about what you are learning.



Interdisciplinary Learning

Discover how what you are learning relates to other fields and the world around you.



Information Fluency

Gain skills in evaluating, creating, and utilizing information and technology across various formats and platforms.



Creative Productivity

Show your understanding by creating something unique. Go outside the box to make your ideas a reality.



Leadership Development

Identify and enhance your leadership skills through collaboration with others to make a difference.



Cultural Intelligence

Understand how culture and context influence people's views and learn to value, adapt to, and interact with diverse populations.


