There are no exceptions to this expectation. Applicants also need to be available to attend at least one section of seminar (times to be determined). Each section meets once per week for 75 minutes. Honors Peer Mentors must also be available for training on Thursday, August 17 and the morning of Friday, August 18. Some meals will be provided throughout the training experience.
